

Decoration Guidelines

November 1 – March 15

Winter wreaths and other artificial decorations are permitted during this period. All decorations, including wooden crosses, must not exceed 36 inches in height. Decorations containing spikes or stakes are strictly prohibited and will be removed immediately.

Live or artificial wreaths may be purchased through the cemeteries. The cemetery assumes no responsibility for damage to bouquet holders resulting from use during winter conditions.

March 16 – October 31

During this period, only fresh flowers placed in approved bouquet holders are permitted. Wilted flowers are removed each Tuesday to facilitate grounds maintenance. Fresh flowers will otherwise remain undisturbed.

Artificial decorations are not permitted during the mowing season, except for designated holidays. Holiday decorations will be removed the Tuesday following the respective holiday.

Burials: Floral pieces are left on the grave for 48 hours after a burial. The flowers are wilted by this time and it becomes a nest for animals if left any longer. There is no regulation governing the number of floral decorations brought to the cemetery at the time of interment.

Entombments: Three floral pieces permitted outside of the building. Bouquets will be removed and discarded at the end of each work day.

Please make sure to label your decoration(s) with the deceased name and location.

We hope you can understand our position in establishing these guidelines. They are not of our personal choice but an absolute necessity in maintaining safe working conditions and the overall beauty of our Catholic Cemeteries.
